Tips for habitat management



Reduce artificial fertiliser use

Let your advisor know if you are cutting or topping before scoring





Avoid heavy poaching and bare soil around feeders and in plots

Reseeding or reclamation of plots can reduce your score






Inappropriate use of herbicides and pesticides will result in less positive indicators recorded during scoring



ACRES (Agri Climate Rural Environmental Scheme) is the new Agri environment scheme.

There are <u>two streams</u> to ACRES:

- **1. ACRES General** is a mix of result-based and prescriptive actions. It is available nationally in all areas outside of the co-operation zones.
- **2. ACRES Co-operation Project** is available in 8 priority areas





We previously administrated the Freshwater Pearl Mussel EIP as a result-based programme and are aware of the challenges that face farmers in our catchment areas.






ACRES West Connacht includes two Co-operation Project (CP) zones:

- Northwest Connacht
- South Mayo / Connemara

The two zones have been broken down into 6 local areas (see map below) with project officers located in each area.

Result-based Payment Schemes

Result-based payments link the nature quality of the habitats on your farm to your environmental payment.

Each field is scored out of 10 using a scorecard that captures the environmental quality of the habitat, which reflects past and current management.

HIGHER NATURE QUALITY = HIGHER PAYMENT LEVEL

The payment scale increases in varying steps between a score of 4 (low quality) and 10 (high quality).



N.B., Maximum results-based payment is €7,000.

Commonages scoring less than 4 receive a payment of €50/ha up to a maximum of 20 ha (see table across ->).

- ••• will provide sustainable benefits for biodiversity and ecosystems (e.g. rivers, peatlands, etc.), while supporting a local rural economy.
- ••• are an opportunity for farmers to be recognised and rewarded for delivering environmental benefits.

Farmer Actions

Non Productive Investments (NPIs) and Landscape Actions (LAs) are a list of actions farmers can select from to help improve the environmental quality of their land and improve their habitat quality.

There is a budget of €1,500 per farmer per year for NPIs and €2,000 per farmer per year for LAs.

Examples of NPIs include fencing, drinkers, footbridges or invasive species control.







Landscape actions are larger actions that may require more time/expertise from the project team *e.g.* water quality issues or large scale invasive species control on commonages.

Farmers can work with their advisor/project team to submit these actions each year.
